<u>Vintage Notes:</u> 2011 was the latest and coolest in Oregon's recent winemaking history. After much stress as to whether the weather would even allow for the clusters the ripen, October delivered enough dry and sunny weather to grant phenolic ripeness and a pleasant dry harvest which was completed mostly in November. The resulting wines are clear, focused and complex—some that will be very long lived in the bottle.

<u>Tasting Notes:</u> Delightfully complex nose of fresh cherry and floral aromas of roses and wisteria that is complimented by accents of clove, cinnamon and vanilla. On the palate, jellied dark berries and spices are framed by well-defined tannins. The lively acidity contributes to an appealing finish. This wine will improve over the next few years. Drink now or through 2019.
